

UNDERGRADUATE AND ADULT MEMBER SCHOLARSHIPS

Guidelines and Eligibility

Adams Electric awards \$1,000 scholarships to undergraduate college and/or adult members working toward advanced education or training. Any money that is not applied to undergraduate applicants may be applied to additional eligible adult applicants, and vice versa.

The cooperative works in partnership with the Adams County Community Foundation to administer these scholarships. Applications are accepted each year from May through mid-July.



Undergraduate College Scholarships

Adams Electric Cooperative aims to award 5-10 scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each to college students who are currently enrolled in and taking classes at a post-secondary school or accredited training program (two-year, four-year, or trade/technical) AND are sons or daughters of a co-op member.

Adult Member Scholarships

Adams Electric Cooperative aims to award 5-10 scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each to cooperative members with their name on the bill/account (not their children) who have been accepted into or are attending a post-secondary school or accredited training program (two-year, four-year, trade/technical) or leadership program that will benefit their employment or community.

To qualify for an undergraduate/adult scholarship, an applicant must meet the following criteria:

Undergraduate Scholarships:

- The student — the son or daughter of a co-op member — must have at least one parent or guardian currently receiving electric service from Adams Electric with an account in good standing, and the parent or guardian must live in Pennsylvania at the time of the student's application for a scholarship.
- The student must be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student and have completed at least one semester at an accredited college/university or an accredited training program (two-year, four-year or trade/technical). Current transcript required with application.

Adult Scholarships:

- The applicant must be a current Adams Electric Cooperative member, in good standing; must have his/her name on an active account; and must be a resident of Pennsylvania at the time of application.

- The applicant must be accepted to or already attending a post-secondary program or an accredited training or applicable leadership program. Acceptance letter or official transcript required with application.

Additional Criteria:

- A head and shoulders photo is required with application.
- The recipient shall be allowed to retain their scholarship for one year from the date of selection, even if they have dropped or are auditing courses if they are still incurring expenses equal to or greater than the amount of the scholarship. Scholarship funds are dispersed in \$500 increments per semester, directly to the school a recipient will attend.
- All scholarships shall be in effect for one year from the date they are approved by the board of directors.
- Adams Electric Cooperative employees, directors, scholarship committee members cannot be a previous Adams scholarship winner in the program you are currently applying.

HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS FOR SENIORS

Guidelines and Eligibility

- Adams Electric awards scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each to high school seniors, who are sons and daughters of co-op members. The cooperative works in partnership with the Adams County Community Foundation to administer these scholarships. Applications, deadlines, and the decision-making process may vary.
- The co-op awards a minimum of one student per school (if eligible applicants) attending each of the following:
 - Bermudian Springs, Biglerville, Big Spring, Chambersburg, Dallastown, Dover, Fairfield, Gettysburg, Kennard-Dale, Littlestown, New Oxford, Northern, Red Lion, Shippensburg, South Western, Spring Grove and Susquehannock.
- Up to five high school seniors attending **cyber, private, home schools and other public schools in Adams, Cumberland, Franklin, Perry and York counties.**

- Up to five high school seniors with plans to attend a post-secondary career or trade school. **This scholarship program specifically benefits pursuits of vocational-technical school students who must become accepted in educational programs leading to certificates/degrees related to building/construction trades, cosmetology, culinary arts, or vehicle technology.**

Once the minimums are met in each category above, then other eligible applicants within each category who meet the program's criteria will be considered. If there are no other applicants awarded, this money can be awarded through the same year's Undergraduate College or Adult Scholarship programs.

Applicants should apply online through the Adams County Dollars for Scholars (DFS) web portal at www.adamscountydfs.org. Applicants must create a login and personal profile on the site to apply. Applications must be submitted between January and April, to be eligible for review and possible selection. Recipients are selected by the Adams County Community Foundation and reviewed/approved by Adams Electric and its board of directors. To qualify for an Adams Electric high school scholarship, each applicant must meet the following criteria:

- 1** The student, a senior in high school, must have at least one parent or guardian currently receiving electric service from Adams Electric with an account in good standing, and the parent or guardian must live in Pennsylvania at the time of the student's application for a scholarship.
- 2** The student must get accepted into a post-secondary institution (two-year, four-year), or the student must get accepted into a vocational, technical, career or trade school.
- 3** The student should maintain a cumulative high school grade-point average of 2.0 (80 percent) or above.
- 4** The student should show a financial need for post-secondary education assistance.
- 5** The recipient shall be allowed to retain their scholarship for one year from the date of selection, even if they have dropped or are auditing courses if they are still incurring expenses equal to or greater than the amount of the scholarship. Scholarship funds are dispersed in \$500 increments per semester, directly to the school a recipient will attend.
- 6** All scholarships shall be in effect for one year from the date they are approved by the board of directors.
